Article 23. Voted that the Town amend Section 3 of the Noise By-Law by deleting the underlined language:

PENALTIES. Section 3. Any person or persons found violating the provisions of Section 1 of this By-Law shall be first warned in writing of said violation. The first violation of this By-Law subsequent to such warning shall be punished by a fine of not less than one hundred dollars (\$100.00). The second violation of this By-Law within 12 months after the first violation shall be punished by a fine of not less than two hundred dollars (\$200.00). Further violations within 12 months after the last violation shall be punished by a fine of three hundred dollars (\$300.00). Each such act which either continues or is repeated after issuance of a warning or other written notice of violation of this By-Law shall be a separate offense and shall be prosecuted as a separate offense. If the violation occurs on the premises of rental property which is a non-resident owner, then the owner must also be notified in writing that the violation has occurred. Action taken on 5/20/91.
